

# SULTANA HIGH SCHOOL INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM

2019-2020 Symphonic Band Syllabus

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## COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class provides opportunities for advanced wind instrument players to continue the study and mastery of their instrument, and apply them through performance appropriate to their ability levels. We will explore and perform classical and contemporary wind literature and further your development as a musician in a variety of ways, including the use of group and individual technique studies, learning various forms of major and minor scales, study the basics of music theory, the critique and analysis of other musical performances, and the research of various related topics. This course will also allow for the opportunity for musical and personal growth as both individuals and as a group, and will be a rigorous performing ensemble with high expectations of success. We will have a minimum of four mandatory concerts in December, January, March and May; Graduation; and traveling to participate in at least one Festival during the second semester.

## CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

In my classroom, there are three guiding principles for a safe and effective learning environment that all students and the teacher will abide by at all times. Each student will do the following at all times:

- 1) contribute to an emotionally safe environment
- 2) contribute to a physically safe environment, and
- 3) respect all property and facilities

In addition, students are expected to follow certain classroom guidelines throughout the year:

### **DO'S:**

- Come to class on time and prepared to rehearse each day, including having all proper materials
- Try your personal best at all times
- Have a positive attitude and don't give up on yourself
- Ask questions when you have them
- Respect and be courteous to all your classmates and teacher
- Follow the classroom expectations and all school-wide rules

### **DON'TS:**

- Eat, drink or chew gum in the classroom or before playing your instrument
- Have any electronic devices turned on or visible in the class under any circumstance
- Disrupt the learning process for other students by being inconsiderate or disrespectful to others or the teacher, including talking or entering the room tardy
- Use foul, inappropriate or derogatory language

## BEHAVIOR & DISCIPLINE POLICY

Students will be expected to follow all classroom expectations and all school-wide rules at all times. Failure to follow these procedures may result in proper disciplinary action, as outlined in the Student Handbook. For all others, the following classroom consequences may be in effect:

### Consequences:

1. Verbal warning
2. 15 minute lunch detention & phone call home
3. 30 minute after school detention & parent-teacher conference
4. Referral to the office

Severe Clause: Any student who fights, damages school property (including that of the teacher or another student), or is disrespectful as determined by the teacher, will be sent to the office immediately with a referral. I also reserve the right to skip consequence steps when deemed appropriate.

## REQUIRED MATERIALS

All students are expected to have ALL materials with them in class, each day:

1. Instrument and all necessary parts in working order
2. All music, warm-ups, etudes, and exercises in their folder
3. A working pencil with eraser
4. Tuner & metronome
5. Valve oil, slide/cork grease, extra reeds, mouthpiece, etc., relevant to your instrument
6. **Enthusiasm, positive attitude, & willingness to learn and make great music together!**

## ATTENDANCE, PARTICIPATION & GRADING POLICIES

**Attendance is Important:** Attendance is an integral part of improving as a musician and as an ensemble. It is said that you do not come to class every day to learn your own part – you come to learn *everyone else's*. If a student is absent, they cannot participate in or contribute to the rehearsal, so their participation grade will suffer. Each student will be held to the school-wide attendance policy, in addition to my own. Every day, each student will start off with 5 points for being present in class with their required materials. An unexcused absence will result in that student not earning those 5 points for the day. It is each student's responsibility to make up the work they have missed due to unexcused absences. At the end of each grading period, the total points earned will be divided by total points possible, and that will be converted into a percentage, which will make up their participation grade.

**Attendance:** Attendance will be taken at the start of each period, during the daily Warm Ups. The ensemble seating chart will be used, and any student not in their assigned seats at the start of warm-ups will be marked absent or tardy. As per the SHS Student Handbook, *"Athletes, cast members, choir members, etc.... must attend 4 class periods on the day of a competition, play, performance, etc.... or he/she may not be eligible to participate in the competition or performance."* All musicians will be held to this.

**Tardy Policy:** For every tardy, 2 points will be subtracted from that student's 5 participation points for the day. This is in addition to the school tardy policy and disciplinary actions, which can be found in the SHS Student Handbook.

**Grading Policy:** My Grading Policy is as follows:

**A: 100% - 90% | B: 89% - 80% | C: 79% - 70% | D: 69% - 60% | F: 59% and below**  
*Daily Participation: 5 pts Performances: 50-200 pts Sectionals: 25 pts Assignments/Tests: TBD*

**Concert Performances:** Band classes are 'co-curricular' and performance-based, so participation in after school concerts, weekly sectionals, and performances are a mandatory part of this class, and a large portion of each student's grade. For all performances, students will need to wear the proper concert attire. Descriptions of that can be found in the Program Handbook on the band website.

**Sectionals:** As part of this class, students will be expected to participate in weekly sectionals when assigned. Sectionals can consist of 1 hour after school, or two half hour lunch sessions. Sectionals must be held with at least 1 other person from the same section, unless prior teacher approval for an exception is given. Students present for the sectional must each complete a Sectional Log and submit by Friday of each week for credit. No late or make-up sectionals will be accepted, without prior teacher approval.

**Juries:** For your final exam, each student will participate in a Jury. This will consist of a pre-selected prepared solo piece on their instrument (with or without accompaniment), exercise etudes, sight-reading, and memorized scales. Students will sign up for a performance time slot during the last week of the semester, and will perform on stage in front of a panel of evaluators. More information will be provided with enough time for students to fully prepare for their Jury.

**Forgetting Your Instrument:** Students will have one 'freebie' each quarter to forget their instrument. After this freebie, students may be asked to serve a 15-minute detention before school, after school, or during lunch. They will also not receive participation points for the day. It is essential to always come prepared to class every day for the success of the student & ensemble.

**Music Folders:** Each student will be assigned their own leather-bound Sultana Instrumental Music folder for the duration they are enrolled in the class, and will fill out and submit a Folder Rental Agreement. This folder will be used exclusively for that student's music, pencil, and music-related books and worksheets. The folder will be returned in its same condition given to them the end of the year, and will contain no major damage. Students will be responsible for promptly replacing this folder if it is lost, stolen, or badly damaged.

**Sultana Arts Academy:** This course meets the requirements for a performing ensemble course within the 'Instrumental Music' track for the Sultana Arts Academy, and can be repeated as part of the program toward the Academy graduation medallion & honors.

## STUDENT & PARENT RESOURCES
